Dear Mr. Hurst:

This is in response to your request for copies of videotapes, supplements, rosters, training records, duty logs, special housing reports, medical staff documents, medical reports, psychological records, and names of recruitment attendees.

We have been informed by institution staff that the search time to locate these documents at all three institutions will be approximately 1,114 hours. According to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552 and the Department of Justice Regulations concerning fees for the production of records, 28 C.F.R. Section 16.11, two hours of search time will be provided, then \$4.00 for each quarter hour will be charged. The search fee for providing you with the requested records will be approximately \$17,792.00, not including duplication fees.

Your request for a waiver has been denied as the reasons stated in your letter do not fall under the requirement of public interest. Dissemination of this information is unlikely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the government, and is primarily in the commercial interest of the requester.

In order to process this request, we must receive a written promise to pay and an advance payment of \$10,000.00 in a check or money order payable to Treasury of the United States. Please send your payment to the Federal Bureau of Prisons, Western Regional Office, 7950 Dublin Boulevard, 3rd Floor, Dublin, CA 94568, Attn: Harlan W. Penn, Regional Counsel, or your may amend your request to reduce the financial burden. Please notify us of your decision within 30 days of the date of this letter or this case will be considered closed.
